This term we will be learning:

Communication/Language – To listen to stories and remember what happens. To use new vocabulary. To answer why questions. To sing songs and join in with rhymes. To begin to speak in full sentences.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development – To play confidently by myself and with friends. To tidy up. To take turns and share. To say how I am feeling. To manage my own personal hygiene.

Physical Development – To hop, skip, jump, slide, roll and climb. To climb stairs independently. To snip with scissors. To hold a pencil to draw and write. To take off and put on my coat and shoes. To brush my own teeth. To use the toilet independently.

Literacy – To recognise and begin to write my name. To explore books. To identify rhyming words. To sing simple rhymes. To talk about our book of the week. To write lists and labels.

Mathematics – To count beyond 5. To say how many I can see. To compare amounts. To begin to write numbers. To talk about and explore shapes, position and pattern.

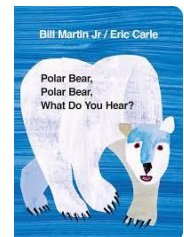
