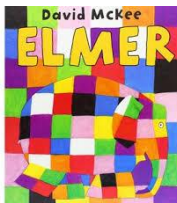

Our Curriculum this term is based on the question:

What makes us special?

Where have all the dinosaurs gone?

Class Novel



What we will explore through the reading:

Through our reading we will learn about different sentence structures, which will support our writing. We will use the predictability of familiar texts to write our own sentences and stories. Through non-fiction texts, we will learn facts and write our own chronological report.

This term we will be learning:

English: We will be learning to read words with phase 5 phonic sounds. We will be reading and writing sentences, using our phonic knowledge. We will be implementing the features of a good sentence in our own writing. We will be starting to write our own simple stories and recalling and writing facts. In reading we will be developing our comprehension and developing a deeper understanding of texts.

Mathematics: We will be looking at numbers up to 50 and understanding the value of each digit in a two digit number. We will be working on our addition and subtraction knowledge and developing our understanding of fact families. We will be counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and learning about measures, such as length, height, mass and volume.

Science: We will be labelling the human body and building on our knowledge of the 5 senses. We will be sorting and classifying animals and learning about animals from the past.
