

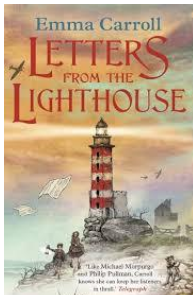

### **What we will explore through the reading:**

Across our reading lessons, predictions and summaries will be created before, during, and after each text. Understanding will be demonstrated by retrieving information, making inferences, and explaining ideas from what has been read. In morning reading sessions, choral and echo reading will support fluency, accuracy, and growing confidence. Texts will include a range of fiction, non-fiction, and poetry.

### **This term we will be learning:**

- **Literacy:** narratives, active and passive voice, descriptive writing, missing person report;
- **Maths:** multiplication and division, fractions, decimals and percentages;
- **Science:** forces;
- **Creative Curriculum:** our Foundation Subjects will be inter-woven into our topic question.

In addition, children should have a sound knowledge of all the times tables up to 12 x 12 upon entry to year 5. If this is not the case, please ensure they practise daily to learn them.

We also expect the children to practise spellings at home on a regular basis. Mathematics homework will be posted every Tuesday and there will also be one topic-based project for the children to complete most terms. This will be linked to our creative curriculum topic we will be covering in class.

### Classroom Organisation
