

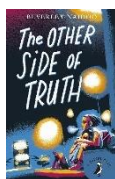

Our Curriculum this term is based on the question: <ul style="list-style-type: none">What do we stand for?	

Class Reading:

Text study of 'The Other Side of Truth' by Beverley Naidoo.



What we will explore through the reading:

Through our reading, we will develop strong comprehension skills by making predictions, inferring meaning and analysing characters and themes. Year 6 will expand their vocabulary and learn how authors use language to create mood, tension, and imagery. We will also build discussion and writing skills by expressing opinions, supporting ideas with evidence, and making connections to our own experiences and the wider world.

This term we will be learning:

English: We will be writing a range of fiction and non-fiction texts linked with the Other Side of Truth. This will include a setting description, a newspaper report and an explanation text. Moreover, we will be creating our own finding tale narrative.

maths: Our main areas of learning in maths will involve ratio, algebra, fractions, decimals and percentages, area, perimeter and volume and statistics.

science: During this term, we will be learning about the circulatory system and how it works to transport oxygen and nutrients around the body. We will explore the roles of the heart, blood, and blood vessels and learn why this system is vital for keeping us healthy.

creative curriculum: We will be investigating the question, 'What do we stand for?' with links to Nigeria and the Global Goals in Geography and the protected characteristics in PSHE. As part of our topic, we will also be writing a blog to document our learning in Computing and focusing on composition and performance in Music.

Due to the exams (SATs) for Year 6 in May, our teaching will involve revision and booster sessions, as well as usual daily lessons. It is an opportunity for your child to catch up with work they have missed or which they find difficult. Children have access to Mathletics, TTRS and Purple Mash online, as well as useful grammar websites to help them study. They should be encouraged to make use of these during this important term.
