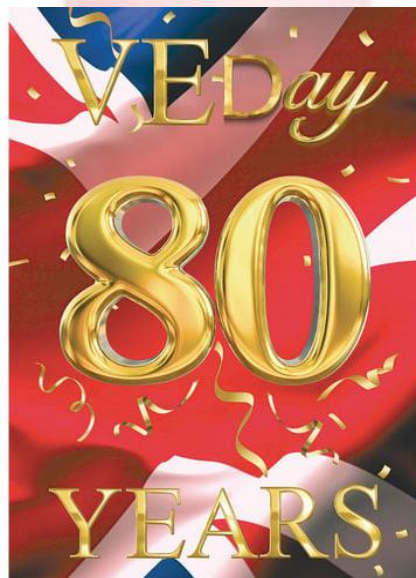


To mark the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of VE Day
