What we are covering this term: Literacy

This term we will be encouraging the children to become more independent in their writing, focusing on spelling common words correctly and using correct punctuation. They will be reading a variety of texts linked to our topic and focusing on developing their comprehension skills. Children will be learning to sequence sentences to form a short narrative.

Numeracy

Counting within 100 and in steps of 2, 5 and 10 both backwards and forwards. Children will be introduced to division and finding halves and quarters of shapes and numbers.

The children will further understand their understanding of measures including capacity.

Science: Finding out all about **growing things**, and the conditions needed for growth.

Other subjects: This term in history, we will be learning about the fossil hunter Mary Anning. In Geography, we will be locating the North and South Poles on a world map. We will be making models of dinosaurs and penguins.
