

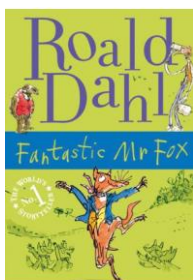

### What we will explore through the reading in English and Creative Curriculum lessons:

In English, we will be reading *Fantastic Mr Fox* by Roald Dahl and exploring a range of poetry during our morning reading sessions. In Creative Curriculum, our reading will link to our topic on rainforests, where we will explore texts about animals, deforestation, and the Global Goals.

### This term we will be learning:

**English:** reading fiction and non fiction texts and writing a variety of narrative and non-narrative texts including a suspense story and a non-chronological report;

**Maths:** place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division;

**Science:** plants and pollination, rocks and soils, skeletons, creating plant and magnet mazes;

**Creative Curriculum:** Learning about rainforests and investigating deforestation with

#### Homework and ideas to support your children at home with their learning

Homework may include English, Maths or Creative Curriculum based work.

**Reading:** Children will be expected to have their reading folder in school each day, library books will be swapped every Monday.

#### Classroom Organisation

##### Timings of the day

- Doors open at **8:35am** and close at **8:45am**.
- Late arrivals must report to the office.
- **Lunch time** is from **12:00pm** until **1:00pm**
- **Home time** is at **3:15pm** when children are collected from the Key Stage 2 yard.

**Forest School** Forest school will be on Wednesday mornings.

**P.E.** P.E. will be on Wednesday afternoons. Children need to wear their red school PE t-shirt, black shorts or leggings, and trainers from home. Tracksuits can be worn in colder weather. For Forest School, children need to wear wellington boots - these will be kept in school for the term.

##### Swimming

This term, **3CL class** will be **swimming on a Wednesday afternoon**. They will need a swimming costume or swim shorts and a towel in a named bag.

##### Uniform Expectation

All children are expected to wear a white shirt or polo shirt; grey or black trousers or skirt; a red or blue sweatshirt and plain black school shoes. Headscarves, if worn, should be shoulder length and either plain black, blue or red. **No necklaces, bracelets or earrings should be worn in school.**
