

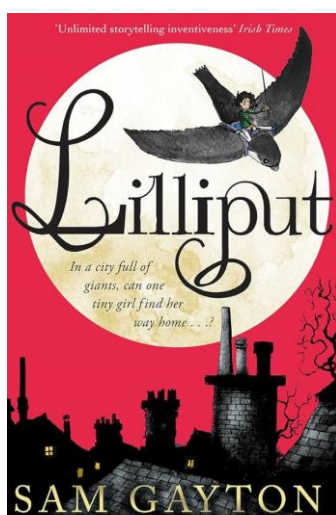

Our Curriculum this term is based on the question: Does change always make life better for everyone?	

Class Reading:

Lilliput



What we will explore through the reading:

Through our reading, we will be exploring themes of: freedom vs captivity; home and belonging; friendship; bravery and ingenuity.

We will be applying our read aloud, think aloud skills (prediction, personal connections, text-to-text connections, identifying a theme, clarification).

This term we will be learning:

English: This term we will be writing: a descriptive piece; persuasive letters; diary entry; instructions; narrative; discursive argument.

Our particular targets are: in **writing**, using complex sentences and creating effective, organised texts; in **reading**, comprehension – inference and deduction; in **spelling, grammar and punctuation** – word classes; cohesive devices; active and passive voice.

Maths: We will be covering: **place value; addition and subtraction; multiplication and division; fractions; converting units.**

We will also be applying knowledge and strategies effectively through oracy discussions.

Creative Curriculum: We will be investigating the question, *Does change always make life better for everyone?* As part of our topic, we will explore: Victorian inventors; life as a Victorian child; evolution and inheritance; electricity and light; trade routes; air pollution.
