

Our targets for this term:

Reading: to hear and say the initial sound in words, to segment and blend the sounds in simple words, to know which letters represent some of the sounds, to link sounds to letters, to begin to read words and simple sentences, to use vocabulary and forms of speech that are increasingly influenced by their experiences of books.

Writing: to give meaning to marks they make, to use some clearly identifiable letters of the alphabet to communicate meaning, to represent some sounds correctly and in sequence, to write their own name and to attempt to write short sentences in meaningful contexts.

Mathematics: to recognise some numerals of personal significance, to recognise numerals, to count objects/actions that cannot be moved, to select the correct numeral to represent objects, to use the language of 'more' and 'less' than correctly, to say 'one more', 'one less' than a given number to 20, to begin to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting during practical activities/discussions and to record using marks that they can interpret and explain.
