
## <u>Wingrove Primary School</u> <u>Attendance Newsletter – Spring Term 2025</u>

## Overall attendance

# **Children in primary school are expected to have attendance of above 96%.** The government has set this target of **96**% for all schools and we are expected to reach that each term. This term January 2025 – April 2025, we have achieved **93.0%**, which is significantly lower, so we need to work together to improve this.



The Local Authority have introduced a stepped approach to Fixed Penalties on unauthorised leave during term-term.

\*Each penalty is <u>per parent per child</u>. The stepped approach to fixed penalties applies within a rolling 3- year period.



1<sup>st</sup> Offence - £160 fine, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

2<sup>nd</sup> Offence - £160 with no reduction for early payment.

3<sup>rd</sup> Offence – referral to court.

Although we strive for good attendance for all children, we understand that anyone can be ill. If your child is too unwell to come school, then please phone to let us know.



## Holiday and leave of absence

We continue to work closely with the local authority in relation to issuing fines for holidays taken during term time. This is an increasing problem and we feel our pupils should not miss valuable education. This term we had **35 children** each missing on average nearly **2 weeks** of their education due to **unauthorised absence**.

Please look at the school term calendar and plan your time away during school holiday time. Penalty fines will be enforced accordingly.

The calendars are available from the school office and are on the school website and in noticeboards.



## Illness

All children at some point are ill, which means that they cannot attend school.

If your child has sickness and diarrhoea then they cannot attend school for **48 hours. However**, if your child has a minor complaint such as a runny nose or sore throat, then they should attend school. We find, in most cases, that children are so busy in school that they tend to forget their little illnesses very quickly.

The doors will open from **0835** each morning. Reception to Year 6 pupils should be in class ready for registration at **0845** prompt.
