Ouseburn Farm

A working farm, popular visitor attraction and vibrant green space in the heart of the city, where everyone's welcome and entry is always free. Ouseburn farm is home to a variety of animals, from those you'd expect to find on a farm such as sheep and cows to more exotic creatures including Terrapins and Bearded Dragons. Half term activities include Slime Spies, Reptile Pamper Sessions and Bunny Grooming.

BALTIC

The BALTIC Centre for Contemporary Art, housed in a completely renovated flour mill on the south bank of the River Tyne, is the biggest gallery of its kind in the world and entry is free. On Wednesday the 19th and Thursday the 20th of February between 10.00 and 18.00 the gallery is hosting free drop-in family days: two free days of creativity and play for you and your family! Come together at BALTIC with artist Richard Bliss to create circles of love and fill the space with images, colours, textures, ideas and words.

Jesmond Dene and Pets Corner

This popular nature spot is the perfect place to visit if you love being outdoors. Its narrow, wooded valley follows the river Ouseburn and is home to lots of wildlife. One of the dene's best loved areas is Pet's Corner which is home to animals of all shapes and sizes, including alpacas, pot-bellied pigs, goats and sheep as well as rabbits and colourful birds.

Discovery Museum

Discover all about life in Newcastle and Tyneside. The museum is bursting with interactive displays, which makes it the perfect place to learn and have fun. Visitors to the Discovery Museum can reap the benefits of free entry and it's positioned within Newcastle with great transport links. The displays are regularly updated and complemented by an array of free, fun learning activities and a changing programme of exhibitions. Workshops during the February half term (may incur a charge) include "Play + Invent" and "Crafty Family Fun".

The Rising Sun Country Park

This attraction, in the heart of North Tyneside, is ideal for long walks and wildlife and animal-spotting. Covering 400 acres, it includes an organic farm, a nature reserve, a countryside centre and numerous ponds, woodlands and extensive areas of grassland. Families can make the most of a play park too as well as a cafe, picnic areas and a farm where visitors can see pigs, calves, poultry, sheep, ducks and small animals.



The Sunderland Museum and Winter Gardens

Just a short Metro ride away, Sunderland's fascinating history is waiting to be explored at this attraction whose collections date back to 1846. They contain plenty surprises for those who have never been, including its aged resident Wallace the Lion. Visitors can also see the first Nissan car to roll off the production line at the Sunderland factory in 1986; learn about the area's shipbuilding past; view the works of matchstick men artist LS Lowry, who visited the area often, and explore the Winter Gardens' botanical collection of more than 2,000 plants and trees as well as the Jurassic Gardens.

The Great North Museum

The Great North Museum: Hancock is an award-winning family attraction in Newcastle upon Tyne. It is free to enter and open daily. Over the February half term there will be daily planetarium shows (£2 per person) and Albany's Explorer Trail where young adventurers can search the museum for the explorer's kit. Other activities include storytelling, an explorer's day and tales of engineering for under 5s.

Northern Stage

The Newcastle theatre invites young ones to The Storyteller which will get under way on February 8. Featuring stories collected from around the world by storyteller Chris Bostock, the show is described as perfect for under-fives and the first story is Fish Tales which will journey to the bottom of the sea.

Elswick Pool

Elswick Community Leisure Centre is a community-led, not-for-profit centre for fitness, health and fun. It houses a public gym and a swimming pool that, due to its layout, is suitable for all swimmers. Over the half term the pool will have extended opening times made up of family fun sessions, lessons (booking essential) and ladies only times.

Outdoor Cinema in the Square

Head down to Times Square to enjoy some of the best family films on the big screen. Tickets vary from completely free to £12 depending on whether you want to sit on a bench or snuggle around a fire pit.
