

**What we will explore through the reading in English and
Creative Curriculum lessons:**

In our English lessons, we will be reading the traditional tale of Aladdin taken from the collection of stories known as The Tales of Arabian Nights. Through this book, we will explore themes of bravery, kindness and heroism. These themes will also be explored through our study of the Roman Empire and our topic question – What qualities make a hero?

This term we will be learning:

English: how to write an effective diary and newspaper article;

Maths: mass and capacity, money, time and properties of shape;

Science: plants and pollination, lights and shadows;

Creative Curriculum: The Roman invasion, a comparison of Islam and Christianity, field work and map work of our local area and coding.

Homework and ideas to support your children at home with their learning

In addition, children should have a sound knowledge of all the times tables up to 12 x 12 upon entry to year 4. If this is not the case, please ensure they practise daily to learn them. The children can access Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Star apps with their log in details.

We also expect the children to practise spellings at home on a regular basis. These will be posted on Seesaw each week and spelling tests will be on Fridays. Mathletics homework helps children consolidate their learning in school as well as being great fun. Topic based projects will be linked to our creative curriculum topic that we will be covering in class.
