What is Bullying?

Bullying is when a person is hurtful or unkind to someone else, on purpose and more than once. Bullying can be done by one person or by a group of people and can be towards one person or a group of people.



Physical: Damaging belongings, hitting, kicking.

Verbal: Name calling, insulting, making offensive remarks.

Indirect: Spreading nasty stories and rumours, exclusion from groups.

Cyber Bullying: Setting up 'hate websites', posting nasty messages/stories on the internet, sending abusive text messages or emails.

Prejudice related bullying: because of race, culture, gender, disability or because of shape, size, looks or because of who or what we like.

Bullying can happen at school, after school and online.



Who Can I Tell?

If you are being bullied, you need to tell someone. Don't suffer in silence, Speak out!

If you are being bullied...

DO:

- Ask them to STOP if you can;
- Use eye contact and tell them to go away;
- Ignore them;
- Walk away;
- Use the thoughts and feelings box if you can't speak out openly about it;
- TELL SOMEONE.



DON'T:

- Do what they say;
- Get angry or look upset;
- Hit them or retaliate in another way;
- Think it's your fault;
- Hide it.

What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying;
- Tell an adult, friend, buddy or playground leader what you have seen;
- Stand up for someone by including them in your games;
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.

All the staff and children will work together to:

- Make our school a place where everyone can feel safe and happy. That means NO bullying is accepted or tolerated.
- We will all help everyone to get on with each other and we believe that everyone has the right to be who they are.
