Cross Curricular Theme

Our key question this term is 'What Makes a Happy Ever After?' We will be exploring what makes us and others happy. We will be discussing how to take care of each other, animals (our school pets) and the environment (in forest school). We will be reading and performing traditional tales and writing up some of our own.

Homework

Your child will bring home a reading book each week which will be changed on their reading day. Please take time every day to share the story, read it together and talk about what is happening. Please write a comment in the reading record book or sign to show that you have shared it together.

From next week your child will also bring home the phonic sounds we have been learning in class to practise. They will be given a writing pencil, a laminated alphabet, number board and dry wipe pen. This is to help your child practise their letter and number formation with you at home.

Organisation

- Children must be accompanied to the classroom door.
- In the morning, the doors open at 8.45am and close at 8.55am. Children must be in school by 8.55am.
- Hometime is 3.15pm. Children must be collected by an adult who is named on their collection list.
- Children have a mid-morning break and healthy snack. They are also offered milk every day.
- Children have English and Mathematics sessions in the morning and access other areas of the curriculum in the afternoon.
- Children are not allowed to bring sweets or toys to school.

Lunch times

We have lunch together in the hall at 11.40am followed by an outdoor break until 12.55pm. The children are able to see the choices before they go to the hatch and select their own main meal and pudding each day.

Uniform
