

Foodbanks in Newcastle

Foodbanks provide emergency food aid for people in crisis who have little or no money to buy food for themselves or their family. A mix of rising bills, changes to benefits, low paid jobs and no jobs are conspiring to put ever greater pressure on incomes and squeezing household budgets until there is very little left for essentials like weekly groceries.

Foodbanks are run by volunteers who provide parcels or bags of food donated locally or by supermarkets through schemes like Fareshare. Newcastle CVS has produced this leaflet as a guide to some of the foodbanks operating Newcastle. It is not a list of all of Newcastle foodbanks and you are recommended to check opening times and criteria before going to one.
