

Checklist for Parents and Carers

Organisation

- Children must be accompanied to the Reception side gate.
- In the morning, the gates open at 8.35am and close at 8.45am. Children must be in school by 8.45am.
- We have lunch together in the hall at 11.30am followed by an outdoor break until 12.55pm. The children are able to see the choices before they select their own main meal and pudding each day.
- Hometime is 3.15pm. Children must be collected by an adult who is named on their collection list.
- Children have a healthy snack and are also offered milk every day.

Uniform

Children must wear the correct school uniform every day including school jumper, white polo shirt, grey trousers or skirt and black shoes.

Your child is entitled to a free red PE t-shirt which your child should have received already.

In reception we go outside every day, despite the weather, to play, learn and explore. Please make sure your child has a warm coat. In winter they will also need a hat, scarf and a pair of gloves with them every day.

All items MUST be clearly labelled with their name.

Our Curriculum

Our key question this half term is **'How are you feeling today?'**

We will be exploring our feelings, what makes us and others happy or sad and how we show our happy or sad feelings?

Next half term our topic is **'What lights up our world?'** We will be talking and learning about our families, things that light up, fireworks and different celebrations.

We will explore our topics through story, circle time, role play, art and craft both inside and outside during Forest School.

We will also be reading, retelling and performing some traditional tales.

Children have English, mathematics and phonics sessions each day. We also have adult and child led activities throughout the day where children have the opportunity to explore other areas of the curriculum and reinforce their learning through play.

Homework

Initially, the children will be bringing home a picture book to share which will be changed on their reading day. As we progress through the phonics scheme, we will be sending a book home for the children to practise reading their sounds, along with a picture book.

During this half term, your child will also bring home the phonic sounds we have been learning in class to practise. They will also be given a writing pencil, a laminated alphabet and number board and dry wipe pen as the term progresses. This is to help your child practise their letter and number formation with you at home.
