

What we are covering this term:

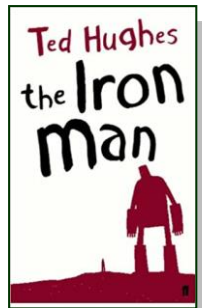
English: The Iron Man; word classes, including adverbs, prepositions, nouns, adjectives and conjunctions; narrative writing
