

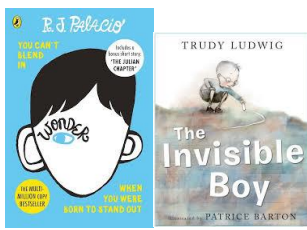

What we will explore through the reading:

This term, our focus in reading will be on developing a range of important skills. We will be making predictions and writing summaries before, during, and after reading, as well as completing comprehension tasks by retrieving key information, making inferences, and explaining our understanding.

In our morning sessions, we will also use choral and echo reading to build fluency, accuracy, and confidence when reading aloud. Children will have the opportunity to enjoy a variety of texts, including fiction, non-fiction, and poetry.

This term we will be learning:

Literacy: non-chronological reports; recounts; modern fiction; poetry

Maths: place value; addition; subtraction; multiplication and division methods

Science: Earth and space; materials and their properties

Creative Curriculum: our foundation subjects will be inter-woven into our topic question. We will study natural disasters (earthquakes and volcanic eruptions) as well as the Titanic tragedy.

Homework, including on-line, termly projects and ideas to support your children

Please read regularly with your child at home. Frequent reading for pleasure and understanding is essential homework and has long-term benefits: new language, enhanced comprehension and improving ideas for writing in school are just some of these. In addition, children should have a sound knowledge of all the times tables up to 12 x 12 upon entry to year 5. If this is not the case, please ensure they practise daily to learn them.

We also expect the children to practise spellings at home on a regular basis. Spellings will be added onto spellingframe weekly. Mathematics homework will be posted every Tuesday and there will also be one topic-based project for the children to complete each term. This will be linked to our creative curriculum topic we will be covering in class. These must be completed at home and then be brought into class by the deadline
