Organisation

- Children must be accompanied to the Reception side gate.
- In the morning, the gates open at 8.35am and close at 8.45am. Children must be in school by 8.45am.
- We have lunch together in the hall at 11.45am followed by an outdoor break until 12.55pm. The children are able to see the choices before they select their own main meal and pudding each day.
- Hometime is 3.15pm. Children must be collected by an adult who is named on their collection list.
- Children have a healthy snack and are also offered milk every day.

Uniform

Children must wear the correct school uniform every day including school jumper, white polo shirt, grey or black trousers or skirt and black shoes (**no trainers** except PE days).

In Reception we go outside every day, despite the weather, to play, learn and explore. Please make sure your child has a warm coat. In winter they will also need a hat, scarf and a pair of gloves with them every day.

All items MUST be clearly labelled with their name.

Our Curriculum

Our key question this half term is 'What do we see in Winter?' We will be exploring seasonal changes, hibernation, cold places and animals that live there. Next half term our key question is 'Who lives in a house like this?' We will be exploring our homes and families, different buildings and structures and materials

We will explore our topic through story, circle time, role play, art and craft both inside and outside during Forest School. We will also be reading and performing traditional tales and writing some of our own.

Homework

Your child will bring home two reading books each week which will be changed on their reading day. One of these books is a scheme book using the phonic sounds the children have been practising. The second book is a reading for pleasure text, chosen by your child. Please take time every day to share the story, read it together and talk about what is happening. Please write a comment in the reading record book or sign to show that you have shared it together. During this half term, your child will also bring home the new phonic sounds and tricky words we have been learning in class to practise.
