

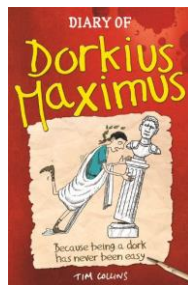
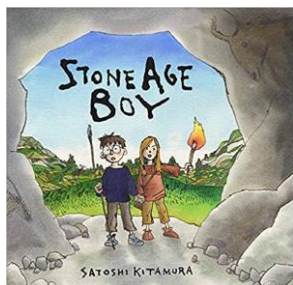
What we are covering this term:

Organisation

Uniform – All children are expected to wear:
