### Organisation

- Doors open at **8:45am** and close at **8:55am**.
- Late arrivals must report to the office.

**Uniform** – All children are expected to wear:

The children have access to **Mathletics** to help support their learning in maths. Please support your child by helping them to log on to this every week to complete their homework. These tasks link directly into the work we are doing each week in maths. Please see class teachers if you need support with passwords.

### Phonic Screening Check
