Organisation

- Children must be accompanied to the Reception side gate.
- In the morning, the gates open at 8.35am and close at 8.55am. Children must be in school by 8.55am.
- We have lunch together in the hall at 11.30am followed by an outdoor break until 12.55pm. The children are able to see the choices before they select their own main meal and pudding each day.
- Hometime is 3.15pm. Children must be collected by an adult who is named on their collection list.
- Children have a healthy snack and are also offered milk every day.

Uniform

Children must wear the correct school uniform every day including school jumper, white polo shirt, grey trousers or skirt and black shoes.

Your child is entitled to a free red PE t-shirt. Please go to the school office to get this.

In reception we go outside every day, despite the weather, to play, learn and explore. Please make sure your child has a warm coat. In winter they will also need a hat, scarf and a pair of gloves with them every day.

All items MUST be clearly labelled with their name.

Our Curriculum

Our key question this term is 'How are you feeling today?' We will be exploring our feelings, what makes us and others happy or sad and how we show our happy or sad feelings? We will explore our topic through story, circle time, role play, art and craft both inside and outside during Forest School. We will also be reading and performing traditional tales and writing up some of our own.

Children have English and Phonics sessions in the morning and Mathematics in the afternoon. We also have child led activities throughout the day where children have the opportunity to explore other areas of the curriculum and reinforce their learning through play.

Homework

Your child will bring home two reading books each week which will be changed on their reading day. One of these books includes pictures only and is for you to share with your child and encourage them to talk about the pictures. The second book is a reading for pleasure text, chosen by your child. Please take time every day to share the story, read it together and talk about what is happening. Please write a comment in the reading record book or sign to show that you have shared it together.

During this half term, your child will also bring home the phonic sounds we have been learning in class to practise. They will also be given a writing pencil, a laminated alphabet and number board and dry wipe pen. This is to help your child practise their letter and number formation with you at home.
