## **What we will explore through the reading:**

We will be continuing to build on our reading skills, developing fluency and comprehension skills. We will explore texts and use these as inspiration to help write our own stories and learn new vocabulary. We will also build on our sight vocabulary and learn to read more tricky words which will help with our fluency.

## **This term we will be learning:**

**English:** We will be learning to read words with phase 5 phonic sounds and learning new spelling patterns. We will be reading and writing sentences, using our phonic knowledge and punctuating sentences correctly. We are going to be learning to write a series of sentences to form a short narrative. We are also practising forming upper and lower case letters correctly.

**Mathematics:** We will be looking at numbers up to 100 and understanding the value of each digit in a two digit number. We will be solving problems involving multiplication and division. We will be telling the time and identifying the value of different coins. We will also be naming 2D and 3D shapes and discussing their properties.

**Science:** We will be identifying and naming common wild and garden plants. We will also be observing the changes across of the four seasons as well as looking at planting and where our food comes from.
